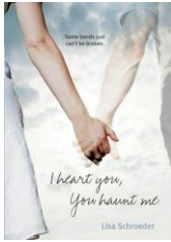

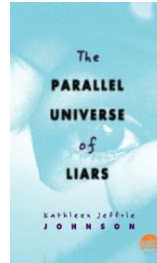

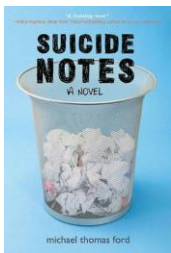
Ava can't see or touch him but she hears his voice like whispers in her mind. Despite what others think Ava knows without a doubt that her true love Jackson is back from the dead.

By Michael Thomas Ford

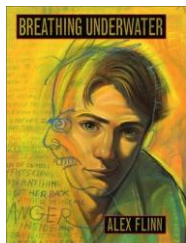
Jeff refuses to relate to the other teens in a psych ward where he's been placed after a suicide attempt, but he'll soon have to confront some truths about himself.

By Malcolm Rose

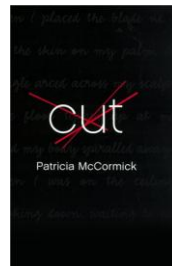
Anke constantly witness her father's abuse at home. But when she makes the volleyball team at school, she slowly begins to find her voice.

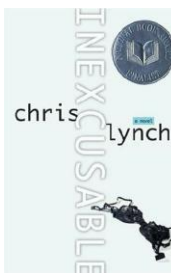
The diary of a teenager whose life is forever changed (and eventually destroyed) by a terrifying addiction to drugs.
