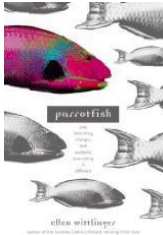

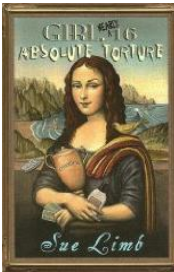
Parrotfish

When Angela decides to become Grady, things finally feel right. But no one seems to want to let Grady just be himself.



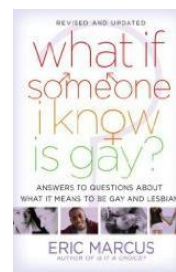
Hello, Groin

A non-fiction book that covers a wide variety of topics and answers questions asked by real teens.



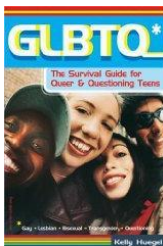
Hear Me Out

True memoirs of teens that have confronted, and now speak out against, homophobia.



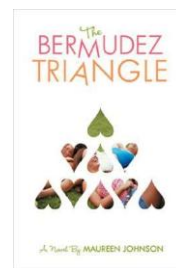
The Order of the Poison Oak

Russel decides to become a camp counsellor but discovers it's a lot more work than he imagined. And then there's the new secret society...



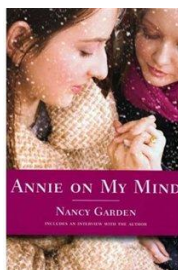
